

Jay and his wife, Caitlin, were a part of the church planting team that launched Mustard Seed Christian Church Nagoya in 2009 before being sent to Osaka in 2011 to pastor a new church plant in that city of 19 million people. The churches in Osaka and Nagoya then worked together to plant two more churches in Kobe and Kyoto in 2016 and 2017. Currently, the Greers are preparing to plant another church in Tokyo as part of Mustard Seed Network's goal of planting 12 churches in 12 Japanese cities by 2025. Jay and Caitlin have four city kids, Rowen, Frankie, Isla, and Makoto. Jay's heart beats for preaching the gospel, raising leaders and unreached church planting. He enjoys his wife's music, wrestling with his kids, coffee, spicy food,

and the Denver Broncos.


